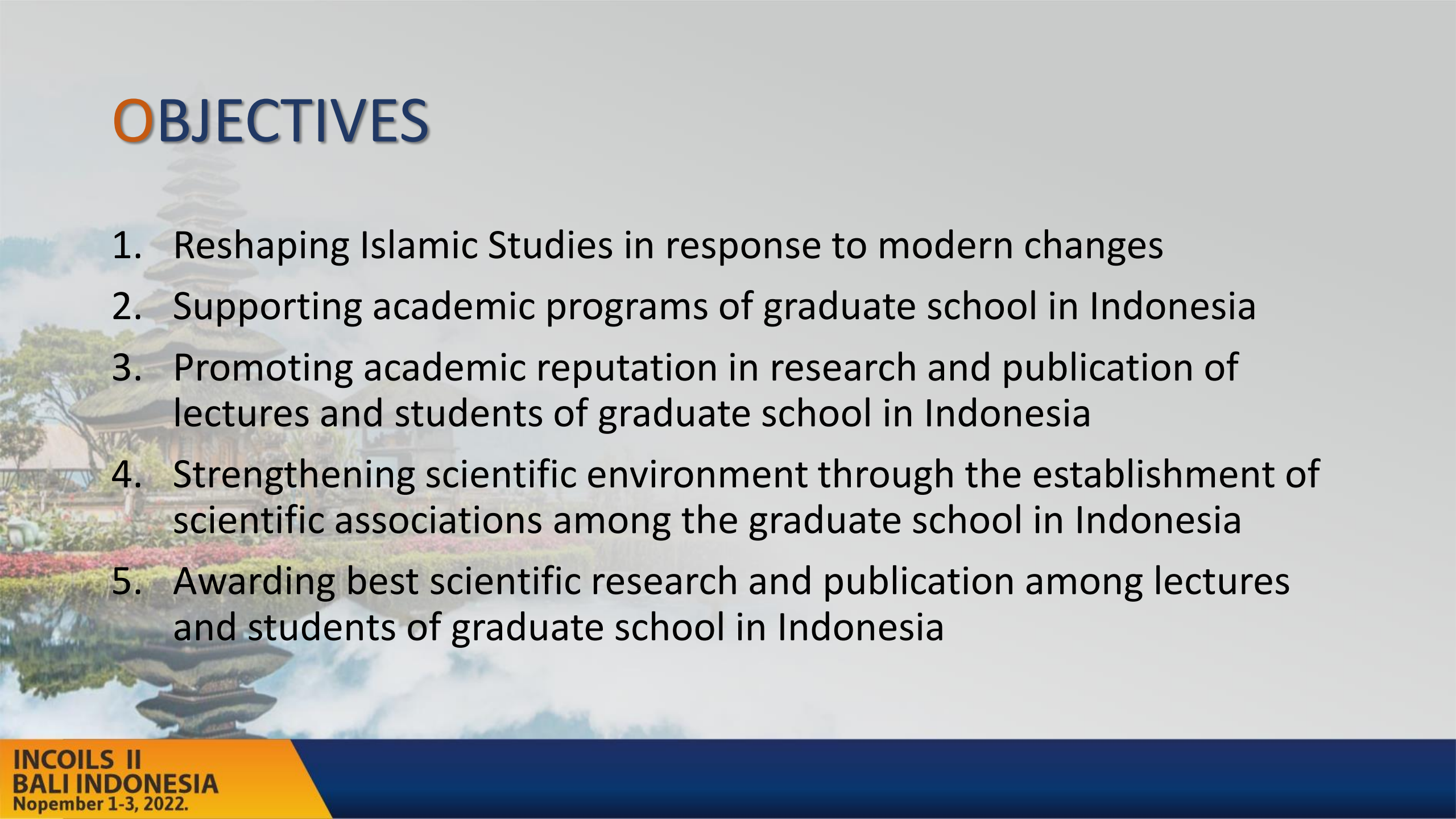

Alhamdulillah, all praises and gratitudes we pray to Allah SWT, hopefully what we do is always given guidance and useful for human benefit. Furthermore, I welcome the second International Conference on Islam, Law, and Society (INCOILS) activity, hopefully this activity will be better for incrising higher quality in the future. I hope this international conference will encourage all Islamic universities to have an international reputation.

Postgraduate is the best place to prepare superior human resources in the field of science and technology. In the competition for the advancement of a nation, the role of qualified postgraduate students is very strategic, so universities must continue to organize themselves and keep abreast of developments and changes that occur by improving the quality of papers in class, research theses and dissertations so that they are worthy of being presented in seminars at international forums both international seminars, international conferences so that they are worthy of publication in reputable scientific journals.

This second INCOILS activity is a very good effort to improve the quality of postgraduates, especially students, including their lecturers. Because this activity encourages them to write better, including compsoing academic research papers in class to be of higher quality. Postgraduate as mandated by the IQF-based curriculum requires the use of multidisciplinary, interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary learning approaches in learning. This INCOILS activity with the theme Islam, Law, and Society is an effort to realize that, besides that the vision of scientific integration in Islamic religious universities can actually be realized as aspired since its inception.

Therefore, studies and research in postgraduate programs must be sourced from the results of research and the latest journals, so that the content of the paper is no longer focused on general theories, but is based on research results based on facts and data so that they will not only enrich the scientific treasures but also improve the quality of papers that are based on strong research, so that the results can be utilized by the wider community. In addition, a good paper will have an impact on improving the reputation of the institution and the accreditation value of study programs and institutions. This is what all of us should encourage so that this kind of event should be held every year.

REMARKS

First, improving lecturer competence and professionalism. Academic staff play an important role in developing the quality of higher education institutions. The higher the competence and commitment of academic staff, the higher the reputation of the university will be recognized. According to current data, for example, there are only 588 professors at Islamic universities out of a total of 40,124 lecturers. This number is divided into 18,166 PTKIN and followed by 21,958 PTKIS. Of these, 4,171 are professors or head lecturers. This picture clearly shows how we are faced with the shortage of human resources. It is still a challenge for our lecturers in terms of academic contribution or rather academic reputation at the international level. This is of course another matter. Therefore, we must continue to improve academic professionalism.

Second, good academic staff governance. Another standard for developing leading universities is good governance. This system can cover all aspects of higher education including academic and non-academic affairs. In the academic field, three mainstay areas, namely teaching and learning activities, research and community service programs are crucial issues to be developed. Regulation and law enforcement in accordance with standard mechanisms are the main elements of transparency. This will lead to the rationalization of the management system that is adhered to by standard operating procedures (SOPs) at all levels of the management system. Everyone will feel protected and guaranteed to carry out their roles and rights. This mechanism will treat people equally regardless of their different backgrounds.

Especially in the non-academic field, the availability of the superstructure is very important. As technology develops, high-tech values and infrastructure must work together to support each other. At the value level, for example, we are required to provide facilities that serve people with special needs, women and children. It is a common standard to make all systems conform to this. Technological tools, furthermore, have also become an absolute necessity. Once we meet these requirements, it will automatically strengthen the management system in realizing justice and welfare.

Third, research and publications. This category is the main task of universities in supporting the needs of society and society in general. Research is one of the pillars of the contribution of universities to the community who need solutions. Academic activity is not an exclusive endeavor. They, moreover, are geared towards meeting social needs. Therefore, universities need to examine what are the main needs and priorities of the community. These fields can be in the fields of religion, education, health, communication, technology etc. Along with these efforts are publications. Publication is a means to introduce the reputation of the college, on the one hand, and research findings to be shared among the academic community on the other. It is at this point that professionalism, higher education recognition will remain in universities in the world. Once again I emphasize, we need to develop productive research and optimal publications

Last but not least, once again I thank you, and I hope we can be successful in developing our Islamic Universities in the future.

REMARKS

REMARKS

On this occasion, I would like to convey two important things that we really need to work on in developing our Higher Education. First, the need for strengthening academic culture. We need to strive for our universities to become references or targets of academic destinations for international academics to come here as students. There have been many foreign students who have benefited from several universities in Islamic universities, but the number is still small. Again all of this has to do with academic reputation. Academic reputation is closely related to the academic culture developed by universities. The core of academic culture refers to the channels of communication and interaction between university members. It is considered as one of the effective determinants of higher education policy. The interaction of students and lecturers, communication between the academic community and students and all members of our university needs to be strengthened. Such a phenomenon leads to an increase in knowledge. The increase in knowledge will not happen by itself but requires an appropriate background. Therefore, all of us directors, professors, rectors, deans and all lecturers need to always be involved in the creation, sharing and application of knowledge. A system of beliefs, values and cultural practices is a must-have element in our university. This is certainly an implicit pattern of meaning such as action, where all members including lecturers to communicate and share the same experiences, perceptions and spirit of pursuing and developing knowledge and science.

We can take an example, how professors and lecturers have a strong commitment to developing their abilities and share that knowledge with students and colleagues in developing knowledge. Research activity, frankly, should be geared towards gaining reputation, not funding; how far we have established cooperation between students and lecturers in this regard. Again, I emphasize that this objective and success will depend on the environment we create in our colleges. I hope this point will be on the agenda of the Postgraduate Program in particular and Islamic universities in general.

Second, the need to pursue an international reputation. There are many ways how we need to develop our universities, and especially graduate schools, to be recognized globally. The international reputation for our university today is unavoidable. We need to prioritize building a strong vision to be achieved in a certain timeframe as outlined in the strategic design of institutional development. We need to publish and market our university in the world forum. This effort is to attract foreign students and lecturers to come and collaborate with us. Without such a strategy, our university is only a local player.

REMARKS

I hereby appreciate the excellent conference program that has been designed by the INCOILS committee. The big theme of this conference is Social Resilience, Sharia and State which is very relevant for our current meeting discourse. I believe this conference will be useful on a practical level, especially in providing policy recommendations related to Islam in the context of the Indonesian nation-state and the context of legal pluralism in this country.

We need to support this INCOILS activity to respond to changes that occur at the moment and future predictions towards the era of the industrial revolution 5.0, so the latest themes and contain novelty must be the main priority. In addition to this activity, it is very useful to support postgraduate academic programs and climate in Indonesia as well as to promote research results of postgraduate students and lecturers in Indonesia through strengthening the scientific environment, establishing scientific associations between graduate schools in Indonesia, and awarding the best research and scientific publications in the community. lecturers and postgraduate students.

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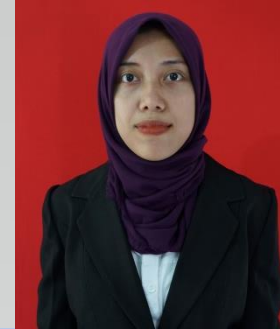


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
